



Walk-in Screening Mammograms Are Here!

Breast Cancer Screenings:

- Women should have mammograms each year starting at age 40 and continue for as long as there are no serious health problems.
- It's one of the best ways to detect breast cancer when it's very small, often several years before a lump can be seen, felt or a woman has symptoms.
- A screening mammogram is a simple, quick, easy, and safe breast X-ray. It uses less radiation than a dentist X-ray.

Walk-In Program Details:

Patients at NMCP, Branch Health Clinics (BHCs), or Tricare Prime Clinics (TPCs) for any medical service may qualify for walk-in screening mammograms. Check eligibility at the mammography desk during your visit.

You may qualify if you...

- are enrolled in Tricare Prime and have been assigned to a PCM at NMCP or one of the BHCs.
- have had no mammogram in the last 11 months or more.
- have no current breast complaints.
