Graduate Medical Education

NMRTC's rich history as a teaching hospital dates back nearly 100 years to 1924 when general rotating internships were established in naval hospitals to ensure standardization of training. In 1926, seven Navy hospitals were among the American Medical Association's list of internships approved for training. NMRTC is among three of the original seven that remain today and has become a thriving center of Graduate Medical Education.

NMRTC offers over 16 programs - from internships to residencies to fellowships for Medical, Dental and Medical Service Corps - for 275 to 280 trainees per year. Fellowship programs include Pain Management, Musculoskeletal Radiology, and Clinical Psychology Postdoctoral Fellowship.

Internship and residency program specialty areas include emergency medicine, internal medicine, general surgery, orthopedics, pediatrics, psychiatry, anesthesiology, otolaryngology and obstetrics/gynecology, radiology, general practice dentistry, oral and maxillofacial surgery, and transitional year internship.
