- **Mission:** Develop graduates who are prepared to practice full scope general pediatrics in an isolated duty station; including the ability to stabilize and resuscitate a sick neonate and to manage critical illness in older children.
- Fully **joint Air Force + Navy** training program in fully joint Pediatrics Department



- ACGME accredited for 36 trainees (12/year)
 - Most heavily concentrated fleet environment in Department of Defense; **~36,000 pediatric patients.**
 - Busiest delivery service and Neonatal Intensive Care Unit in DoD
 - Military Partnership with **Langley Air Force Base Hospital** [General Pediatrics Community Hospital Rotation]
- **Civilian partnerships** with **Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters** (Norfolk, VA) [Pediatric Emergency Medicine, Pediatric inpatient ward, various elective rotations] and **Virginia Commonwealth University Children's Hospital** (Richmond, VA) [Pediatric Intensive Care Unit + Trauma Center]

Didactic Curriculum:

- Morning Report 0730-0800; M,T,W, F
 - Academic ½ Day Weekly on Thursday [4 hours of protected academic time]
 - Monthly Journal Club
 - Monthly Review of Inpatient Processes Conference
 - Weekly Continuity Clinic Small Group Discussion
- **Resident Voice:** Resident-led wellness committee, resident leadership opportunities, biannual off-site resident business meeting and townhall, annual program wide resident retreat, etc.
 - **Scholarly work:** Must participate in scholarly work. Additional research project is not required. QI and research supported by resident research committee, annual resident research fair and co-location with Navy-Marine Corps Public Health Center for Navy Medicine East.
