
GENERAL PROGRAM GOALS

The overall programmatic goals are in accordance with the standards described by the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA), which states that the GPR residency will prepare the Resident to:

- 1. Act as a primary care provider for individuals and groups of patients. To include: providing emergency and multidisciplinary comprehensive oral healthcare, providing patient-focused care coordinated by the general practitioner, and directing health promotion and disease prevention activities.
- 2. Plan and provide multidisciplinary oral healthcare for a wide variety of patients, including patients with special needs.
- 3. Manage the delivery of oral healthcare by applying patient and practice management concepts and quality improvement that are responsive to a dynamic healthcare environment.
- 4. Function effectively within the hospital and other healthcare environments.
- 5. Function effectively within interdisciplinary healthcare teams.
- 6. Apply scientific principles to learning and oral healthcare. To include using critical thinking, evidence or outcomes-based clinical decision-making, and technology-based information retrieval systems.
- 7. Utilize the values of professional ethics, lifelong learning, patient-centered care, adaptability, and acceptance of cultural diversity in professional practice.
- 8. Understand the oral health needs of communities and engage in community service.




Naval Medical Center, Portsmouth occupies a 112-acre site along the Elizabeth River in downtown Portsmouth, Virginia. It is located on the original site of Fort Nelson which was built in 1776 to provide harbor defense for Norfolk and Portsmouth. In 1827, construction began on the Naval Hospital, and by July 1830, a portion of Building One was occupied. Naval Medical Center, Portsmouth has provided continuous care since that time and remains the oldest hospital in the U.S. Navy. In 1960, Building 215 was constructed to accommodate the ever-increasing demands of the Naval Medical Center. As the military establishment grew, Naval Medical Center, Portsmouth became the major military medical facility serving active duty Navy, Marine Corps, Army, Air Force, and Coast Guard, their families, retired personnel, their dependents and other beneficiaries authorized treatment in uniformed services clinics and hospitals. In June 1990, the Naval Medical Center broke ground on a major construction project designed to build a modern replacement hospital with extensive support structures and services. The project was completed in 1998 and began operations in 1999. The Charette Health Care center is a 1.02 million square foot facility and the most modern available in the Navy inventory. The center contains over 300 clinical exam rooms, 140 specialty exam rooms, and 17 operating rooms. In addition, the base features a research facility equipped for animal research projects, a mini mall with a Navy Exchange, banking services, galley and fast food operations, Olympic-sized pool, state-of-the-art gyms, MWR services, and a library.
